Under Special Item Number (SIN) 20-316, you can purchase high-tech Photo ID cameras, including Digital Card Print Systems. These cameras and print systems can be used to produce high-quality color or black and white photo identification cards and passes, such as employee ID cards and passports. Card and passes can also be upgraded to include magnetic strip or bar encoding, signature capture devices, or other high-tech security features. SIN 20-316 also features the related accessories for Photo ID cameras, such as plastic cards and pouches used to hold ID cards, badge attachments, photo die cutters, slot punches, punch laminators. Also included in this SIN is any ancillary software used to produce Photo IDs, magnetic readers and encoders and digital printer supplies.

Photographic Laboratory Systems

Schedule 67 also includes a wide range of photographic laboratory systems, found under SIN 20-130. These systems have the capability to accept images from any format, such as photocopies, prints, film, transparencies, digital files, CDs, memory cards, emails or files directly from a digital camera, and transfer them to another type of format, like photo ID cards or stickers. This SIN also includes internet mini-labs, which give you the ability to instantly print high-quality digital images, such as photo IDs. It's like having high quality photo production capabilities right in your office.
