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

# *GSA Expo Survival Guide*

**W**e know attending GSA Expo requires a significant time investment for our customers, and we understand how important getting the most out of time away from the office is. With a bit of advance planning, strategic positioning, and some division of labor, you can maximize your GSA Expo experience.



# Expo Advance Planning



## Establish Goals

Before Expo begins, take some time to think about what you want to get out of the training sessions. Are there gaps in your training that need to be filled? Write down some professional goals you want to achieve through the sessions being offered at Expo. If there are particular people with whom you wish to connect or re-connect, make a list of subjects you want to discuss. Identify which vendor booths may help you achieve your goals and visit them.

## Review the Training Schedule and Conference Floor Map

Look at the Expo training schedule and determine what sessions may help you achieve the goals you have established. Mark the conference floor booth map with the vendors you are most interested in visiting. Strategize your route and set aside plenty of time for discussions and delays.

# Expo Advance Planning

## Choose Sessions Based on Your Goals

Highlight all the sessions on the schedule that you consider valuable, including those that overlap. Prioritize your list based on your established goals and determine which sessions you will attend and those from which you wish to obtain class materials.

## Divide and Conquer

If you are attending Expo with a group of individuals from your agency, get together and determine if there are goals common among the group members. To facilitate the broadest coverage of subject matter, divide session attendance strategically among the group. You can also do this on the conference floor to save time and maximize the benefits of your booth visits.

## Time and Energy Management

Manage your time wisely. Make sure you are well-rested for sessions. Allow yourself time in the morning to have a light breakfast and review your schedule for the day. Have a backup plan in case a class is cancelled or doesn't meet your needs. To keep sleepiness from setting in, avoid heavy foods at lunch.

Visiting the conference booths in an organized, strategic way will help you reap the maximum benefit. Try to limit the items you collect on the floor; take only those materials you think will be useful – don't hoard promotional items. Carrying heavy bags full of conference paraphernalia can quickly tap your energy and lead to information overload. If you collect too much information, you may be unable to discern what was really important. And consider the shipping costs!

# Expo Attendance

## Training Sessions

Attend each session and ask questions. Arrive a few minutes early and network with the other attendees. This can give you an early indication if the class will meet your expectations. Collect business cards from people you meet who could be valuable contacts for the future. Be attentive, and if the class is not what you expected, go to a different session on your list. You may also opt to visit classrooms of sessions you are unable to attend to collect class materials.

## Review, Share, and Compile Notes


Schedule some time each day to review and share class notes. Begin to compile an overview of all the subject matter for use when you return to the office. This will help solidify the information you have absorbed – the best way to understand a subject fully is to try to explain it to someone else. Consider making a binder of conference information and notes that fellow employees can use as a resource.



# After Expo

Compile all your notes and materials. Talk with the other attendees from your office and gather all group materials. Have each individual write a summary of his or her experience at Expo. Include what was learned, contacts made, and goals achieved – and indicate how you intend to apply what was learned to benefit your organization.


Keep a binder handy for organizing valuable materials acquired in the classroom or from the main floor of the conference. You may choose to create a special folder of information relating to your specific goals, designate a space for items to share with colleagues within your organization.



In your phone list or rotary files, recap and organize contacts made at Expo. Include a key word or phrase to help you remember how they relate to your role or your organization.

## Feed Your Head



*How, when and what you eat can dramatically influence your energy level, concentration and retention. Here are some tips for eating smart while attending GSA Expo.*

**A light breakfast** is the ideal way for your body and brain to begin the day at maximum effectiveness. Consider a hard-boiled egg and fresh vegetables, high-fiber cereal (such as oatmeal or shredded wheat) with low-fat milk, or an egg-white omelet with Canadian bacon and reduced-fat cheese.

**Healthy snacks to the rescue!** Carry a bag of nuts or pumpkin seeds with you for snacking in the mid-morning or afternoon. Eating every three to four hours will stabilize your blood sugar and sustain your energy level. Avoid chips, candy and other junk foods.

**Avoid excess caffeine.** It's a vicious cycle. The more you consume, the more likely you are to experience withdrawal symptoms, become tired, and consume more caffeine. Try decaffeinated coffee or herbal tea instead.

**Fiber-licious!** High-fiber foods are slow to digest – helping you feel full and energized for long periods of time. Try strawberries or high-fiber cereal at breakfast, a spinach salad with chicken or fish at lunch, and an apple for an afternoon snack. Each of these choices will ensure your body is working at its best while you enjoy your Expo experience.

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# Planning Your Stay

GSA Expo 2008





GSA has arranged special blocks of rooms with local hotels exclusively for GSA Expo attendees and exhibitors/non-exhibiting vendors. Please read all of the following information before making your reservation.

#### **Government/Military Per Diem and Conference Rates**

In accordance with the Federal Travel Regulation 301-747.7 and 8, the General Services Administration has evoked the conference lodging allowance for the GSA Expo/training conference in Anaheim, CA. The conference lodging allowance is a pre-determined maximum allowance of up to 25 percent greater than the applicable locality lodging of the

per-diem rate (i.e., \$118). This rate shall be allowable for all employees of any agency authorized to attend the conference. This includes all federal agencies and Department of Defense civilian employees. Under this reimbursement method, employees will be reimbursed for the actual amount incurred for lodging up to the conference lodging allowance.

The per-diem rate for Anaheim, CA for 2008 is \$118 for lodging and \$64 for M&IE rate. The maximum lodging rate allowed under the conference regulations is \$147.50.

We have some of the hotels listed for the Expo at the per-diem rate of \$118, but most are at the conference rate. In continuing on to make your reservations, be sure to check the rates under each hotel, and make your reservation early.

### Shuttle Bus Service

GSA provides a free shuttle bus service for your convenience from all official hotels with the exception of those within walking distance.

### Cancellations

The 2008 GSA Expo Housing Bureau must receive all cancellations by March 18th, 2008 to avoid penalty charges. You may submit your cancellation in any of the following ways:



# The *Flames* of October

On Monday, October 22, the fires were raging in Southern California. *Los Angeles Times* photojournalist Karen Tapia-Anderson was driving back and forth in the canyon looking for working firefighters.

“Santiago Canyon Road was the only impediment between the houses in the canyon and the fire,” she said. “I had heard that because of the high winds, the fire burning to the south was going to jump the road and get to the houses there.”

It’s the nature of the work for press photography to be competitive. The photographs of the recent fires in Southern California that had been appearing in the *Los Angeles Times* were, in her words, “so phenomenal” that she knew she needed a photograph that was equally magnificent. But perhaps she ended up getting more than she had bargained for.

She came upon a group of Orange County firefighters laying hose to fight a spot fire moving up a ridge. A California Department of Forestry Service crew on the scene started battling it with hand tools. But meanwhile, another fire to the right had started pushing toward the first group of firefighters. Someone from the Forestry Service crew began yelling “Spot, spot,” to warn the Orange County band, who numbered a dozen. They turned on their hoses, only to discover that they had burned and were useless. Down on the road, the fire truck blew its horn to get their attention. The Forestry Service crew had retreated

and was out of harm’s way. But the erratic wind had blown the flames so that they were now completely surrounding the Orange County crew, other than on one side of the ridge that was too steep to descend. And as the flames started encroaching on them, there was nowhere for them to go but higher up the ridge. They began deploying their fire shelters.

“This fire was like the perfect storm,” said fire captain Mitch Kahn, who was one of the twelve. “There had been unbelievable drought conditions building over the last year, the most severe in California over the last hundred years, with a total of only six inches of rain. This was combined with the most severe Santa Ana winds, which could reach 50 to 60 miles per hour in the canyons. And at the latest possible time in our fire season, the vegetation was at its driest—it would have been dry even in a rainy year.” Finally, all this was understood by one twisted individual—the arsonist who set the fire that would go tearing down two different canyons, covering four miles in fifteen or twenty minutes.

Karen carries two digital cameras with her, one with a 300mm telephoto lens and the other with a 70 to 200mm zoom lens. Usually, when her subject is people, she will zoom in close to give as much detail as possible. But in this case, she photographed the firefighters donning their fire shelters with the lens opened wider so that she could include the flames surrounding them.

The winds were strong, and it was difficult for them to get into their shelters, which flapped like a sheet in the wind. Once they climbed into them and laid down, she only had a visual on two of them. She was impressed with the calmness of those down near the road. She heard one of the captains call on his radio for an air unit. The hand crew was sent back up, but they were beaten back by the flames.

“As a journalist, I lost it for the first time. My face was covered with goggles and a shroud to keep the smoke out, and I was wearing a helmet.” So along with all the wind and noise, no one could hear her crying. “Even now, I get emotional, because it seemed so senseless that they could be burning. They could be dying. Finally, you could hear the chopper.” On the first pass, it did not make a water drop. Likely, it had to make a definite visual first. But it did make the drop on its second pass. Finally, they started emerging from their shelters.

As they came down from the ridge, Karen was surprised to see that one of the twelve firefighters was a woman, and thought to herself that hers was the same reaction she was sometimes given from others on seeing that she was a woman photojournalist.

“I thought they would embrace after everything that had just happened, but they just brushed themselves off and walked down the steep, smoldering, charred hill.” They smacked hands, but there was not much emotion—at least outwardly. But battalion chief and division leader Mike Rohde wrote later, “I can’t recall a tougher fight in my 30-plus years here.” A little while later, their throats sore from the smoke, they all went back to fighting fires.

The photograph of them putting on their fire shelters appeared the next day in the *Los Angeles Times*. Later that day, she saw the same firefighters back on the job. Of course they asked her for copies, and of course she sent them.

## Equipment Availability

*The Ocean County Fire Authority in southern California buys numerous items from GSA to stay supplied and prepared, according to Susan Morris, who is with their ordering service.*

*Items they have purchased from GSA include road flairs, work gloves, backpacks, nozzles, shutoffs, pack sacks, wild land tools, adapters, MRE's, cutting boards, can openers, canteens, oven thermometers, wild land helmets, grocery carts, McLeod Fire Tools, gear bags, and a variety of other equipment.*

*And yes, GSA also sells fire shelters.*

*GSA quick-response teams delivered firefighting equipment to firefighters and supplies to evacuees to assist in the support of the California wildfires using both internal distribution centers and contingency contracts established with multiple award schedule contractors. GSA received a request for supplies at 4:30 a.m. on Monday, October 22, and delivered 10,000 blankets and 10,000 cots by 2:45 p.m. that same day. This expeditious shipment was achieved through the contingency contracting vehicles that GSA had recently established to support FEMA in the event of a disaster. GSA continued to make more deliveries throughout the day directly from GSA's Global Supply Western Distribution Center. Items delivered included a 52,171-pound shipment of fire fighting materials, such as sleeping bags, fire*

*shelters, firefighter gloves, hoses, nozzles, valves, helicopter cargo swivels, and meals-ready-to-eat. An additional 5,600 blankets were delivered by 8:30 p.m. for evacuees sheltered in San Diego's Qualcomm Stadium and GSA support continued throughout the week.*





Air-conditioned tents, chairs, tables, and menu options were all offered. Within days, this GSA vendor was able to equip three field kitchens and begin serving hot meals daily. Meals were served according to a schedule, which

included a three-hour window for breakfast, a boxed lunch, and a four-hour dinner service.

Vendors such as these stand ready to provide prompt services to any future disaster-relief programs, with manpower and resources available for immediate response and deployment.

# HydraMax<sup>®</sup>

Improved Hydration System  
Creates AbilityOne Jobs



In recent years, personal hydration systems have become a big business with hikers, bikers, and the U.S. military. These systems offer a practical dehydration solution to athletes and warfighters. But Roger Masadi, an engineer at the U.S. Army Soldiers Systems Center (Natick), noticed a problem.

Hydration systems have come a long way since the first prototypes of IV bags in socks with tubes attached,” says Norm Slader, Director of Engineering Services at The Lighthouse for the Blind, Inc. (Seattle Lighthouse) in Seattle, Washington. “But even with the modern designs, people fall, and the packs bust open.” Slader adds commercial systems can be difficult to keep clean and dry because of their design and will mildew if improperly cleaned.

Under a development contract with National Industries for the Blind (NIB), Masadi and Slader set out to make a better personal hydration system through the cooperation of their respective teams. Their primary objectives were that the product must be strong and durable, easy to clean, and hygienic. After months of testing, Seattle Lighthouse successfully added the newest design in personal hydration systems to the AbilityOne (formerly the Javits-Wagner-O’Day Program or JWOD) Procurement List and the GSA Global Supply (GGS) program as SKILCRAFT® HydraMax® hydration equipment.

The HydraMax product line offers a more sterile option than competitive models while creating jobs for people who are blind and working with the AbilityOne Program. By using a seamless, blow-molded bladder instead of the sheet bladder that is used by other manufacturers, HydraMax hydration products eliminate the potential accumulation of dirt and other particles in the seams of the device. This state-of-the-art design minimizes health concerns, as well as the frequency of cleanings, resulting in a system that keeps users healthy and lasts longer than comparable systems.

“The Lighthouse bladder component of the HydraMax is unique because it is rigid enough to keep its shape, easy to keep sanitary, clear in color, and flexible enough to mold to a person’s back,” says Slader.

Other recently developed lines of HydraMax systems include 100-oz. and 120-oz. water reservoirs, which are carried backpack-style and equipped with bite valves and drinking tubes, enabling warfighters to stay hydrated while mobile. But the Seattle Lighthouse high-performance drink system stands out as the most popular item, with proven success in sales to Base Supply Centers (BSCs) across the country during the past 18 months.

Seattle Lighthouse, which has supported the U.S. military with hydration products for nearly 30 years, supplies hydration systems to military BSCs all across the country. Initial sales figures indicated strong demand for hydration systems in general, but the numbers have far surpassed early estimates. Seattle Lighthouse now reports that more than 320,000 hydration systems sold in fiscal year 2007.

In addition, the HydraMax model has become the standard military-issue item under the AbilityOne Program, which is enabled by the JavitsWagner O'Day Act. The AbilityOne Program is a federal program that creates employment opportunities on federal contracts for people who are blind or have other severe disabilities. All of the high-quality products and services available on the AbilityOne Procurement List are produced by nonprofit agencies like Seattle Lighthouse, which employs 75 percent people who are blind or have other severe disabilities. The AbilityOne Program employs nearly 48,000 Americans who are blind or have other severe disabilities and serves as the largest source of employment for the differently abled in the nation.


The development (and subsequent success) of the HydraMax line is a testament to the abilities of people who are blind or have other severe disabilities and has helped establish Seattle Lighthouse as a credible, capable development partner with Natick.

“What we have done, ultimately, is supply hydration systems to the Department of Defense the same way we supply them with canteens,” Slader says, referencing Seattle Lighthouse’s current position as the supplier of all one- and two-quart canteens to the military. “As sales of hydration systems continue to grow,” he adds, “we will be able to continue on our mission and create even more employment opportunities for people who are blind.”



When booking hotels for official travel, government travelers often face the decision of whether to choose the FedRooms Rate or the “government” rate. The FedRooms Rate is the only preferred government hotel rate. How do the two rates compare?





Studies show that 15 to 20 percent of “government” rates exceed per diem. A hotel’s “government rate,” – which is owned and managed by the hotel – has no set criteria and varies from hotel to hotel. The FedRooms rate is negotiated by the government for federal government travelers. To receive all of the benefits of the FedRooms program, always insist on the FedRooms rate by name. FedRooms offers much more than the hotel-owned government rate and is loaded with benefits that make your life easier, including:

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- Hotels have a two-star (or higher) rating and are FEMA-certified

- Access to and support of the FedRooms help desk at (800) 226-1741

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### Accessibility

Because the program was designed for federal travelers, FedRooms rates are accessible through all hotel rate distribution channels:

- Your agency’s designated online booking tool following a simple two-step process
  - Select a designated FedRooms property from the search results;
  - Choose the FedRooms Rate from the list of available rates.
- Hotel reservation centers. Be sure to insist on the FedRooms Rate by name.
- FedRooms Web site is accessible at [www.gsa.gov/fedrooms](http://www.gsa.gov/fedrooms).

Remember, “government,” “federal government,” and “military” rates are not the same. Contact your agency’s designated travel-management company and ask for the FedRooms Rate. As a federal government traveler, it is in your best interest to use FedRooms hotels and ask for the FedRooms Rate.



# Making the Switch

AbilityOne Employees Excel  
at Switchboard Operations

Smith feels that the switchboard success is a result of its dedicated and passionate staff. "We are hungry to get in there and do a better job than anyone else can do," Smith said. "We are going to give a 150 percent effort because we are totally committed to establishing fulfilling AbilityOne jobs for people with disabilities so they can achieve greater independence."

Alabama Goodwill Industries, an AbilityOne-participating nonprofit agency, provides excellent service on its switchboard contract at the Veterans Affairs (VA) Medical Center in Birmingham. The Birmingham VA Medical Center is a large, 313-bed facility that provides acute tertiary medical and surgical care to veterans of Alabama and surrounding states. One-hundred percent of the switchboard contract employees have visual impairments and other severe disabilities. Through this opportunity, 15 AbilityOne Program employees staff the switchboard 24 hours a day, seven days a week, answering 1,800 calls daily.

"This is one of the most rewarding projects we have ever had," said Don Smith, CEO and president of Alabama Goodwill Industries. "We have been able to employ more people with severe disabilities on this contract than on any prior project. Individuals who typically may not have found employment now have a very good, paying job."

The Alabama Department of Vocational Rehabilitation Services provides the AbilityOne employees who have visual impairments with training and assistive technology to help them succeed at their jobs. Switchboard operator, Donald Parris, who is blind, wanted to utilize his training and education in his profession – and found that opportunity

with the AbilityOne Program. "This would be the first opportunity I have had to make some real money – a truly competitive wage," Parris remarked during his switchboard job interview at the nonprofit. The AbilityOne Program is a cost-effective way to help people who are blind or have other severe disabilities achieve greater independence, as it enables many individuals to reduce dependence on government support and join the ranks of taxpayers.

Parris and the other AbilityOne operators learned many acronyms, medical terms, and alert codes to perform their jobs accurately. "Goodwill put excellent supervisors in place and did a great job in customer service training. The pride operators feel comes through in the excellent manner that they address our customers as they call in."

The AbilityOne Program is a good fit for many federal agencies because it works to meet and exceed customer expectations by collaborating with its federal customers to satisfy their needs with "best-value" products and services. In this case, Goodwill and the VA modified the switchboard equipment to accommodate the AbilityOne employees' special needs. Since the Medical Center is in the rehabilitation business, too, VA understood that people sometimes change their professions as a result of a disability.

Alabama Goodwill Industries provides pre-vocational evaluation, work adjustment services, and transitional and long-term sheltered employment. In doing so, Goodwill assists people who are blind or have other severe disabilities with increasing their daily functioning level and enhancing their job skills. In addition to providing switchboard operations through the AbilityOne Program, Alabama Goodwill Industries also provides janitorial, mailroom, file clerk, food service, and shelf-stocking services to the federal government. Especially notable is the VA Medical Center mailroom operations, for which it has received much praise. Accordingly, Goodwill's track record on other AbilityOne Program contracts at the VA Medical Center assured contracting officers that Goodwill could effectively handle the switchboard project.

## New Innovations in Packaging Technology

Consider the blueberry. Delicate, perishable, covered in dark chocolate. 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

## Anaheim 1940 - 2007

Its mild climate lent itself to creating a land of orange groves. A citrus virus, along with the rising cost of water for irrigation, prompted farmers to sell their land for development. And so Anaheim became a land of commerce, baseball, libraries and entertainment.

*Anaheim 1940 - 2007* from the *Images of America* series shows us places, events and people not with great drama but with the everyday qualities that go into building a city. They are simple photographs, all in black and white.

One dispassionate yet heartbreaking image shows a copy of President Roosevelt's Executive Order 9066 that required Japanese Americans to report to internment camps during World War II. Loyal to the United States, hardworking, and patriotic, many lost nearly everything they owned.

This small but informative volume shows us the faces of politicians and entertainers, athletes, firefighters, and everyday citizens. Its chapters are organized by decades, starting with 1940 through 1949 and ending with 2000 through the present. Through subsequent chapters, one can follow the trends in the architecture, from low-rise commercial structures in the 1940s and 1950s to the glass and steel Anaheim Civic Center, dedicated in 1980.

There are buildings, some shown as they are falling victim to fire and demolition, such as the Mutual Citrus Products pectin plant, which sustained \$75,000 worth of damage in 1948. The author, Stephen J. Faessel, includes seemingly small details throughout his book that lend vibrancy to these photographs, even mentioning the 1915 Seagrave Pumper used in fighting the fire. These are the small details that give a city its character.

Most of the photographs have the basic straightforwardness of simple snapshots, taken to record the moment without regard to beauty or artistry. The very fact that these photographs are not especially dramatic is, in a way, appropriate. Cities, after all, are built less from dramatic moments than from everyday ones.

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


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# LECTURE COURSES

## 1745 – Relocation Allowances, FTR and JTR, Vol. 2 Three-Day Course (\$950)

This class explains in plain language the allowances provided to eligible civilian employees making a permanent change of duty station. Course content: travel authorizations, advances and vouchers; service agreements; househunting and en route travel; temporary quarters; shipment of household goods/automobiles; property management; real estate expenses; miscellaneous expenses; and last move home. Fast-changing updates and streamlining of federal travel allowances make annual (or even twice yearly) training strongly advised.

## 1750 – Relocation Income Tax Allowances Two-Day Course (\$850)

This course looks at the treatment of reimbursed moving expenses by federal tax regulations. Students learn to distinguish between federal tax regulations and the FTR in reaching correct decisions concerning the Relocation Income Tax (RIT) allowances and its impact on personnel assigned to new duty stations.

Frequent changes in tax laws and regulations make annual training advisable for those who must know how to identify and calculate allowable moving expenses and taxable income. Instructional methods include lectures and discussions. Students should bring hand calculators to class.

## Temporary Duty Travel 1760 – Federal Travel Regulation (FTR) Two-Day Course (\$799)

This lecture course teaches students how to compute temporary-duty travel allowances and responsibilities concerning: travel authorizations; allowable transportation; fly America act; contract city-pair fares; per diem allowances; actual expense; eTravel Service (eTS); government travel charge card; receipt requirements; emergency travel; conference per diem allowance; miscellaneous expenses; submission of vouchers. Fast-

changing updates and streamlining of federal travel allowances make annual (or even twice yearly) training strongly advised.

## 1780 – Conference Planning Three-Hour Session (\$450)

This course teaches students the new travel regulations on conference planning, allowing agencies to increase per diem and pay for light refreshments. Discussion includes: where to hold meetings and conferences nationwide; obtain proposals; estimating budget costs; what's included in room rate; using approved hotel accommodations; agency requirements for conferences; and the best times to hold conferences.

## 2060 – Advanced Temporary Duty Travel – Federal Travel Regulation One-Day Course (\$499)

This advanced course provides in-depth discussion of the statute pertaining to travel authorizations and per diem allowances for domestic and foreign travel.

Discussion includes long-term Temporary Duty (TDY) assignments, mandatory use of the contract city-pair fares, and arranging travel services in accordance with FTR amendment 2003-7, eTravel Services, effective January 21, 2004. Additional topics include the mandatory use of the charge card, when conference per diem is allowed, miscellaneous expenses, receipt requirements, and voucher submission. Fast-changing updates and streamlining of federal travel allowances make annual (or even twice yearly) training strongly advised.

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

This ingredient that needs to be replaced is referred to as a “toughener.” This Hysol reformulation affects the items listed below.
