YOUR BEST BUY ON THE FLY

GSA's Airline City Pair Program has grown to new heights over the years to bring you an even higher level of flight offerings, services and savings. And, when it comes to choices to meet your official air travel needs, the sky's the limit with more than 5,000 city pair combinations from which you can choose. The airfares offered to you under this program — *at the government's negotiated contract rates* — are discounted considerably. In addition to saving the federal government billions of dollars annually, this customer-focused program has many other great advantages and benefits that are the best value for you too, such as:

- **No advance purchase required**
- **No minimum/maximum stay required**
- **Tickets are fully refundable**
- **No blackout periods**
- **No change or cancellation fees**

- **Last seat availability**
- **Fares priced on one-way routes, permitting multiple destinations**
- **Stable prices through the year, enabling travel budgeting**

Plus, many of the city pairs have dual fare availability, so you have the additional choice of selecting from two GSA-contracted fares: a highly discounted unrestricted fare (YCA), and a capacity-controlled fare (_CA), which has an even deeper discount to save more money. While _CA fares have a limited number of seats that vary by carrier and by market, there are no other restrictions, so you'll save the most money possible while still enjoying the same top quality service available with YCA fares.

Finding a cheaper fare that is available to the general public at a price that the contract carrier can't extend to you IS a valid

exception to using the government's negotiated contract rates under the City Pair Program. When you find lower cost alternatives for commercial air travel, you should absolutely take advantage of those, PROVIDED you can meet the purchase restrictions associated with such reduced fares and have your agency's approval. These "cheap" fares often have advance purchase requirements, black-out dates, stiff cancellation or change fees, or are even non-refundable. When deciding whether to use non-contract fares, be sure to compare them to the negotiated fares under the City Pair Program.
