



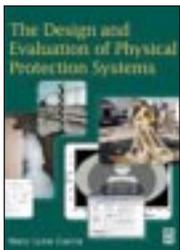

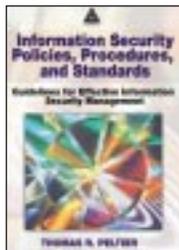

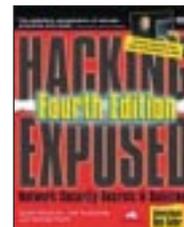


Information Security Policies, Procedures, and Standards: Guidelines for Effective Information Security Management

Hacking Exposed: Network Security Secrets and Solutions, Fourth Edition

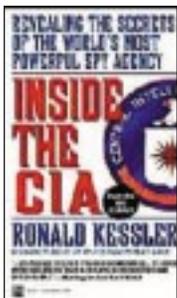

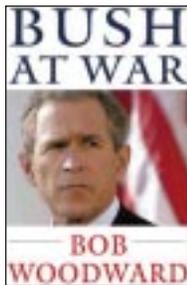


Inside the CIA: Revealing the Secrets of the World's Most Powerful Spy Agency

Readers eventually follow CIA officers and Special Forces personnel into Afghanistan weeks in advance of the U.S. military involvement in the country.
